There will be Wildlife spotting events in the historic graveyards of Old St Runius and St Luke's Baldwin next **Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> June, 10am -12noon at Old St Runius & 2-4pm at St Luke's with some refreshments provided at each church.**

Come and join us for a couple of hours in these beautiful graveyards!

We will try to identify lots of the different types of wildlife which makes the graveyard their home. "Spotter" guides and recording sheets will be provided, and there will be a prize for the biggest set of records! Please bring a pencil, clothing appropriate to the weather and stout footwear (the graveyards have uneven ground)!
