### The week ahead and beyond.....

**\*Saturday 22nd October 2.00 p.m. until approx. 4.00 p.m. Peel and the Transatlantic Slave Trade.** An afternoon tour of locations in Peel, led by Blue Badge guide Phil Craine, to illustrate the island's involvement in the transatlantic trade in enslaved people. Peaking in the eighteenth century, this remains the largest forced migration in human history, with 11 million Africans shipped to the Americas for labour. The Isle of Man punched well above its weight in this enterprise, and the sites visited on the walk will illustrate the breadth of Manx involvement, through the lens of Manx politicians, merchants, captains and mariners. Meet at Weatherglass Corner at 2.00pm, ending with refreshments at Thie dy Vea retreat house. Cost: no charge but donations are welcome

\*Saturday 22nd October 7.30pm at the cathedral: Vivaldi's Gloria presented by the Cathedral Choir, the boys and men of Liverpool Cathedral Choir and the Kirk Michael Orchestra. Tickets: £10 at the door (in aid of the Cathedral reordering).

\*Fairtrade Sale: The Fairtrade sale will be held at the Cooil Methodist Chapel Hall on 27th – 29th October from 10am to 6.30pm each day. A simple lunch is also available each day from 12-2pm.

\*Cathedral Concert Series 2022: The next concert of the autumn series is on Saturday 12th November and will be given by The Mill Ensemble (woodwind) and guest pianist.
